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CITY OF SALISBURY WINS FOR ROAD SAFETY

A City of Salisbury road safety initiative has taken out the top prize at the Institute of Public Works Engineering Australasia (IPWEA) annual South Australian Excellence Awards.

The Council has been recognised for its investment to increase road safety standards for the local community. The Council-led initiative is seeing the use of brighter and more durable pavement markings on roads to retain higher retro-reflectivity.
