### **MOUNT BARKER COUNCIL'S MEGAN BONEHILL IS AN EMERGING LEADER**

Mount Barker Council engineer, Megan Bonehill, is South Australian engineering's joint emerging leader of the year.

Ms Bonehill and engineer Simon Keith from Light Regional Council were named joint emerging leaders at the Institute of Public Works Engineering Australasia (IPWEA) South Australian Excellence Awards.

Ms Bonehill, Chair of Young IPWEA (SA), has been recognised for her commitment to the motivation of graduates and undergraduates into the public works profession.

Ms Bonehill said it was important to encourage young professionals, irrespective of gender or cultural background, to seek opportunities that will help them develop their skills and knowledge despite any discouragement of their chosen career.
