


COMMUTING

- Method of journey to work / study:
 - 77% by car (as driver or passenger)
 - 21% by public transport
 - 2% by active transport (walking, cycling)
- Two-way commute time:
 - 15% less than 30 minutes
 - 38% 31 to 59 minutes
 - 27% 60 to 89 minutes
 - 20% 90 mins or more

KEY FINDINGS

Key challenges:


- Traffic management, congestion, commuting times remain significant issues.
 - 35.6% nominate traffic management issues (almost double metro. and growth area averages).
 - Perception of commuting times have remained relatively stable in recent years.
 - Some concern around the time that road works are taking in some areas.
- Building / planning remains of concern for a small proportion of respondents.
- Local employment and job opportunities are of concern to some respondents.


Key positives:


- Increased satisfaction with Council's performance across many areas:
 - Road maintenance and repairs (up 9.1%).
 - Governance and leadership (up 5.3%).
 - Customer service (up 2.6%).
 - Overall satisfaction (up 2.2%) now higher than metro. Melbourne (6.74).
- Perception of safety at night up 10.3% concern declined across Melbourne.
- Strong agreement with most of the Strategic Delivery statements.





























WHAT ABOUT PUBLIC TRANSPORT

MAJOR WORKS SET TO TRANSFORM OUTER-WESTERN ROADS

Local residents and commuters out west will benefit from a huge package of road upgrade and maintenance works that will cut travel times, improve road safety and better connect communities in key growth corridors.

The Andrews Labor Government has called for Expressions of Interest for the western package of the Outer Suburban Arterial Roads (OSARs) Program – an Australian first, \$1.8 billion investment.

It combines eight high-priority road upgrades with maintenance on more than 700 kilometres of road stretching from Werribee to Footscray, ensuring motorists benefit from new high quality roads while the existing network is maintained to a high standard for years to come.

The upgrades will involve a combination of duplication and widening works to western arterial roads including:

- Dunnings Road and Palmers Road, from Point Cook Road to Princes Freeway, Point Cook
- Palmers Road, from Princes Freeway to Western Freeway, Truganina
- Derrimut Road, from Sayers Road to Dohertys Road, Tarneit
- Leakes Road, from Fitzgerald Road to Derrimut Road, Truganina
- Dohertys Road, from Fitzgerald Road to Grieve Parade, Laverton North
- Princes Freeway/Forsyth Road interchange Hoppers Crossing





- Safety issues have diminished substantially this year, not only in Wyndham but across the western region and growth area councils – perhaps due in part to the State Government elections
- Whittlesea 2017 traffic management (53.5%)
- Melton 2018 safety, policing, crime issues (19.8%)
- Yarra 2018 building, housing, planning and development (24.3%)
- Bayside 2018 building, planning, housing and development (39.1%) Hampton (57.5%), Cheltenham (51.7%)

EAST WERRIBEE EMPLOYMENT PRECINCT


The 775-hectare East Werribee precinct is the largest undeveloped surplus State Government land in metropolitan Melbourne providing an unprecedent opportunity to change the face of Wyndham with an innovative new precinct. The unencumbered land is ideally located in the heart of the City with direct Freeway access and the recent construction of major road works to further support access to the site.

The East Werribee Employment Precinct Structure Plan was completed in 2013 and will guide the development of a mixed-use precinct that will create opportunities for approximately 60,000 local jobs as well as homes, commercial infrastructure, advanced integrated water cycle management, sports facilities, and local parks.

Currently, a portion of the site is utilised as a medical and technology hub with two major hospitals, a private medical specialist centre, three universities and health research operating from East Werribee. The vision is for the existing medical and technology operations to be further enhanced through an increased health and learning offering as well as an enterprise and business precinct.

The model mirrors examples of State's being served by multiple business districts, such as in Dallas-Fort Worth in Texas, USA. With Melbourne's population surpassing 5 million, the timing is now right for the Melbourne metropolitan area to be expanded to provide improved liveability through greater access to jobs and transport connections close to affordable housing.
