### **CAMPBELLTOWN CITY COUNCIL WINS AND SAVES**

A Campbelltown City Council engineering project has won acclaim as the best of its type in the State.

The Council's asset management plan on road renewal has received the top prize in the 'Asset Management Projects Category' at the Institute of Public Works Engineering Australasia (IPWEA) annual South Australian Excellence Awards.

Campbelltown Council's General Manager of Infrastructure Services, Andrian Wiguna, said the partnership between Council and ARRB Group in delivering this innovative solution as part of the asset planning tool has delivered significant financial, environmental and social savings to the community.

"The system has enabled the council to determine the best final treatment for its ageing road network. This has led to cost savings, less interruption to the impacted residents and a reduction in CO2 emissions," said Mr Wiguna.

IPWEA SA President Andrew Craig said the annual IPWEA Excellence Awards recognise talent at the peak of the engineering industry.
